Life Sciences Ireland attended the **TCI Global Conference 2025** in Dublin, a major international cluster event that brought together over 300 delegates. Across all three days, LSI actively contributed to key discussions on cluster-led economic growth, global partnerships and foreign direct investment, as well as health innovation and ecosystem development. LSI reinforced its capability as a cluster organisation, fostering collaboration and strengthening global connections within the life sciences sector.



At the Tri-Region Partnership Autumn 2025 event in Cork, leaders from Cork, Dublin, and Northern Ireland came together to strengthen cross-regional collaboration. Along with HIRANI, (Health Innovation Research Alliance Northern Ireland), LSI played an active role, contributing to discussions on enterprise and innovation, infrastructure and regional development, and cluster and education strategy at UCC. The event further reinforced LSI's position as a key connector between talent, research, and industry across the region.

In 2026, the global life sciences sector is experiencing significant transformation, largely driven by advances in technology & innovation. Key trends include

- The increasing use of artificial intelligence.
- Breakthroughs in gene therapy,
- The evolution of advanced manufacturing techniques.

These developments are redefining the landscape for research, product development, and commercialisation within the sector.
